Modern art was created in 1830, at the time Modern Greece was born. In this relatively short period of 150 years, art in Greece has not only flourished but has also progressed with a vanguard of worthy and creative representatives. One fact that should not be overlooked is that modern Greek art is influenced by the main artistic centres of the world, such as Munich, Paris and, after the war, New York. However, this was a guide but never overshadowed Greek creativity. Thus, a special style was cultivated and maintained, which gives Greek art its Greek style, even though outside influence is highly evident.

The current exhibition of Paintings and Sculpture at the Findlay Gallery is representative of the younger generation of Greek artists, as well as the more established community, covering a wide spectrum of style. Therefore, we see the contrast between the conservative and avant-garde techniques. The exhibition reflects the complete picture of artistic conception and thought cultivated in the past thirty years in Greece. And so, it is representative of abstract art, pop-art, neo-surrealism, as well as several interpretations of realism. I can say in all honesty that this Exhibition represents the full value of artistic expression in Greece today.

We feel that we have fulfilled our aim at this Exhibition and that we have brought to the American viewer a universal representation of style of Modern Greek Art,

as depicted by its contemporary artists.

In 1961 he got the 1st Sculptors' Prize at the 1st Panhellenic Exhibition of New Artists.



He studied at the Athens School of Fine Arts and then at the Academy of Sci-


ence, with a three-year scholarship granted to him.
