THEO HIOS won the Bestin-Show Award in the 30th Annual Guild Hall Artist Members' Exhibition in June, 1969. The award traditionally takes the form of a one-man show the following year.

185 artists were represented in the 1969 exhibition. The jury comprised Jeanne Paris, art critic, Long Island Daily Press; and Victor D'Amico, Director of Education, Museum of Modern Art.

Hios' current paintings, seen in this Award Exhibition, move out of his observation, understanding and interpretation of nature and natural phenomena. His canvasses are concerned with the contracting and expanding elements of a cosmos, the dramatic eye of the hurricane, the cyclonic winds, the boundless spaces of the universe.

The artist was born in Sparta, Greece in 1910. He studied law until he came to the United States in 1930. Until the outbreak of World War II, he studied at the Art Students League and the American Artists School, both in New York City. During the war he served as combat photographer and artist for the United States Marine Corps. He organized the first art classes given in this branch of the service. A visit to Greece in 1953 played an important part in subsequent thematic and stylistic developments in his more recent work.
