

Small Sculptures from Cincinnati Collections

Sculpture from Cincinnati Private Collections comprises not only interesting examples of small sculpture from all periods owned in Cincinnati, but the very arrangement of these periods in the exhibition itself is reminiscent of Andre Malraux's celebrated phrase "a museum without walls." The sculpture is not installed historically or chronologically, but as objects with an affinity to one another. From a fertility figure of the Hurrian period to a mother and child by Henry Moore, or Zorach or Christos Capralos, a basic theme persists across the centuries; and although most of the sculpture measures small by dimension, it stands large in quality.

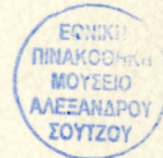
