The College of Applied Art was founded in 1909; since then it developed from an Arts and Crafts School to a Centre, a College of wider and greater activities and responsibilities.

In its present state, the College comprises the following departments: Interior Decoration; Metal Work and Gold Smithing; Mural Decoration; Photography and Lithography; Pottery and Ciramh 3; Sculpture; Stained Glass; Weaving and Textile Printing.

The courses offered at the College extend over five years and cover both the aesthetic and technical aspects of design and production, thus preparing the students to take their part in creating a truly Egyptian style to meet the needs of our times and country, the promotion of good design, and the development of industry.
